8/1-8/31: Ernest Hemingway; Between Two Wars at John F Kennedy Presidential Library & Museum in Boston, MA - The John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum is proud to present a new landmark exhibition, *Ernest Hemingway: Between Two Wars.* Showcasing the JFK Library's Hemingway Collection, this is the first ever major museum exhibition devoted to the work and life of Ernest Hemingway. The exhibit features a trove of rarely exhibited material, including multiple drafts of the writer's major works, correspondence with a legendary circle of expatriate writers living in 1920s Paris, as well as photographs and a selection of Hemingway's personal belongings. Created in partnership with the Morgan Library & Museum, the exhibition humanizes a man who was larger than life and documents the consummate craftsmanship and discipline at the heart of Hemingway's literary genius. <u>http://www.jfklibrary.org/Exhibits/Special-Exhibits/Hemingway-Between-Two-Wars.</u>

8/6: Redcoats & Rebels / Old Sturbridge Village, Sturbridge, MA – See the largest military reenactment in New England with nearly 1,000 soldiers portraying British, Irish, Spanish, Scottish, French and Colonial troops. The Village is transformed into a military camp from the time of the War for Independence, as it was known in early New England. Come see what it was really like for those who fought to win America's freedoms. Watch mock battles and skirmishes, tour the British and American camps, listen to martial music, learn about the daily life of a Revolutionary War solider, see a cannon demonstration, visit the battlefield hospital, and so much more.

8/18-8/21: The Fisherman's Feast, Boston's Oldest Continuous Italian Festival - The Fisherman's Feast is an annual event that began in Boston in 1910 and is based on a tradition that goes back to the 16th century **in** Sciacca Sicily. The Feast is based on the devotion of the fishermen from Sciacca to the Madonna del Soccorso (Our Lady of Help). When the fishermen immigrated to America in the early 1900's, they brought their traditions with them. Today's Feast is much the same as it was over 100 years ago with lights adorning the street and the smell of sausage in the air. The current Feast is organized by the descendants of those original immigrants and still includes a procession of the Madonna through the streets of the North End. <u>http://www.fishermansfeast.com</u>

8/19-8/28: Marshfield Fair - The Marshfield Fair is a traditional, American country fair that has taken place at the end of August every year since 1867. The fair is located on the 62-acre Marshfield Fairgrounds in Marshfield, Massachusetts, our South Shore region. The fair features amusement rides, a midway, typical fair food and extensive farm and agriculture exhibits. It is one of the few remaining fairs that still support 4-H shows and competitions. On three days, there are blues music festivals with local and national talent. Regular special events each year include the demolition derby and tractor pulls. <u>http://www.marshfieldfair.org</u>

Free live "family style" entertainment includes Contemporary Rock, Folk Music and performance art. Named the "Feast of all Feasts" by National Geographic Magazine, this authentic Italian street festival has it all for people of every age:

parades, strolling singers, live entertainment, contests and religious services are held daily. Visitors stroll the beautifully decorated streets sampling the best Italian street foods from 100 pushcarts enjoying arancini, sausage peppers & onion, quahogs, calamari, pizza, pasta and of course zeppole, cannoli and gelato.
