The Normandy Farms Campground, a longtime contributor to the Jimmy Fund charities, is passing down a tradition of supporting cancer research from one generation to the next.

At an appreciation night event held at the Player's Club in Boston on Sept. 21, members of the Daniels family, which owns and operates Normandy Farms, presented a check for \$13,544.

The amount represented both personal donations from patrons, as well as proceeds from special activities at the South Foxboro camping resort during the past year, including basket raffles, "Jail Days," ice cream socials, strawberry festivals, silent auctions and Halloween hayrides and haunted houses.

September's donation marked the 27th consecutive year that Normandy Farms has made a contribution to the Jimmy Fund - with the total amount since 1983 reaching \$220,204.
